In Connecticut, Medicaid covers parents with household incomes up to 155% of the federal poverty level. So if a caregiver is on Medicaid, the household income should be in one of the groups 1-4.

Medicaid/CHIP covers pregnant women in CT up to 250% of poverty level.

So the household income for a pregnant mom on Medicaid could be in any of the groups 1-5.

Children are covered by CHIP up to 300% poverty level.

So the household income for a child on CHIP could be groups 1-5.
